Andrew Thomas and his wife, Ann, have been involved in the pro-life movement in Arizona since moving to the state in 1991. Andrew has served on the Board of Directors of Arizona Right to Life. He also served as the organization's lobbyist at the state capitol in Phoenix. His wife, Ann Estrada Thomas, served on Arizona Right to Life's Board of Directors and as Treasurer for the organization. Ann helped found Voces Por La Vida, a Hispanic pro-life group in Arizona.

Andrew was twice elected Maricopa County Attorney, and helped revise the state's fetal homicide law to better protect the unborn. He is now a fellow with the Selous Foundation, a conservative think tank in Washington, D.C., and director of its Empower the States project.

The Selous Foundation, through these efforts, seeks to return power to the states over issues such as abortion. Andrew's white paper, "Overruling the Courts: How We End the Reign of Liberal Judges in 2016," and his related article in *The Stream* have been widely read and lay out the basis for Article III reforms to curb abuses by activist judges.

Andrew is currently an honorary member of the Board of Directors of the Arizona East Valley Pro-Life Alliance. He and Ann have been married for 27 years. They have four children.
